

Explore Centuries Of Human History -Carved Into A Secret New Mexico Site



Discover thousands of years of human history - on the rocks - on a Photo Tour of La Cieneguilla Petroglyph Site.

Archaic hunters and their Ancestral Puebloan descendents carved nearly 4000 petroglyphs at La Cieneguilla Petroglyph Site. The junction of the Rio Santa Fe and Riito La Cienega drew ancient farmers to settle and irrigate crops here. Residents carved images of birds, turtles, Kokopellis, cloud terraces, water sources, and shamans along the rock fall.

Early Spaniards called it the little marsh (la cieneguilla) when they named the surrounding land grant.

Ten lucky photographers will explore and photograph this spectacular collection of petroglyphs in the morning. We'll return to Albuquerque's nationally-renowned Pueblo Harvest Cafe for lunch, followed by some instruction on how to enhance your morning pictures in Lightroom to resemble what you saw in the field.
