

Explore Centuries Of Human History - Carved Into an Unvisited New Mexico Site



Discover thousands of years of human history on a Photo Tour of Petroglyph National Monument's Mesa Prieta.

Archaic hunters and their Ancestral Puebloan descendents carved nearly 10,000 petroglyphs around Mesa Prieta. Early Puebloans came here for ceremonies, likely to honor their ancestors. The petroglyphs may be stories of epic hunts, records of gods, or signposts to the ancestors.

We don't know for sure - we can't ask the people who carved them.

Ten lucky photographers will explore and photograph this spectacular collection of petroglyphs with the best sunriase light. I'll give you some background along the way, based on my three years of interpreting and photographing the Monument for the National Park Service.
